RE: Processing Techniques

This is a follow-up to a reminder sent to Dispensary Facilities, Hybrid Retailers and Retailers on March 1, 2024 regarding information that shall be included on a cannabis package on an extended content label, a package insert, or using a static quick response (QR) code, and also be available in-store and on the Internet web site of the cannabis establishment that sells the cannabis.

Section 21a-421j-33(g)(1) of the Department's Policies and Procedures requires the above information to also include "the types of cannabis incorporated, as well as *all processing techniques and solvents used to produce and manufacture the cannabis.*"

Processing techniques used to prepare the cannabis product may include, but are not limited to:
