RE: Infused Beverages Permitted for Sale in Connecticut

The Department of Consumer Protection would like to provide additional clarity around what types of infused beverages do and do not meet the requirements for sale in Connecticut. In short, “legacy infused beverages” and infused beverages manufactured by companies that have not been licensed or approved to manufacture these beverages, are not allowed in the Connecticut infused beverage marketplace.

Infused beverages that are allowed for sale in Connecticut meet the requirements below. The Department encourages licensees to review all infused beverages prior to sale to ensure compliance with the following requirements and all other applicable laws:

- Are manufactured by an Infused Beverage Manufacturer licensed by the Department of Consumer Protection or a licensed cannabis establishment that has been approved to manufacture infused beverages. You can check if a manufacturer is licensed or if a cannabis establishment is approved to manufacture infused beverages by using the “License Lookup” tool on <https://elicense.ct.gov>.
- Contain at least 12 fluid ounces.
- Contain 3mg of THC or less.
- Have been tested by a Connecticut-licensed Cannabis Testing Laboratory.
- Prominently display an approved symbol indicating that the infused beverage is not legal or safe for individuals under 21.
- Do not contain alcohol, psychotropic substances or other additives that could increase the potency, toxicity or addictive properties of the infused beverages. This includes caffeine other than caffeine that is naturally occurring in chocolate.
- Are not sold in packages of more than four containers.
- Are not labeled or packaged in a way that appeals to individuals under 21.

We appreciate your continued efforts to comply with the law. Please find attached an Infused Beverage Checklist to help you identify infused beverages that comply with state
