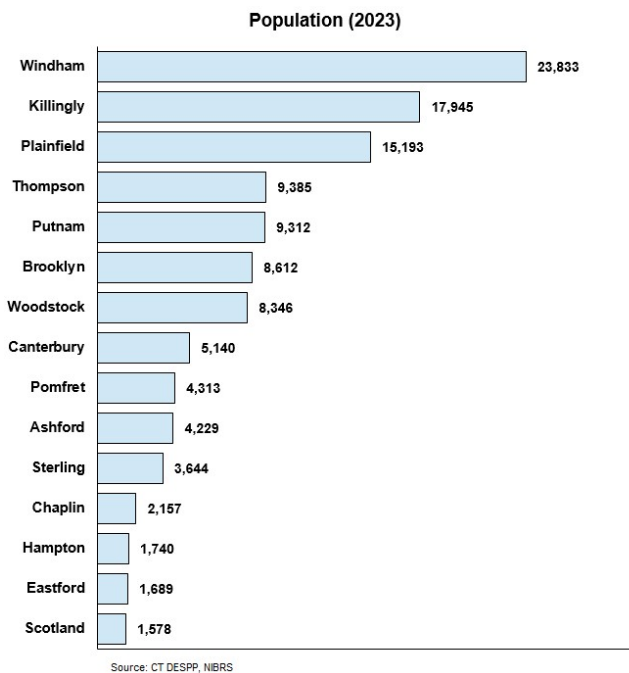

Data Report: Windham JD

Demographics



The Windham Judicial District (JD) serves 15 towns in the northeastern part of the state. The local Geographical Area court (GA-11) is located in the Danielson section of the town of Killingly. Windham, the largest town in the JD, contains Willimantic, an older urban center with approximately 17,100 residents. About 117,000 people live in towns within the Windham JD, making it the smallest JD in the state by population. Covering just over 512 square miles, the Windham JD has the second lowest population density among JDs, after the Litchfield JD. Only 21% of the JD residents identify as members of minority communities. Hispanics are the largest minority group the JD. They comprise 59% of the minority population. Ranked by median family income, Windham JD towns are among the poorest in the state. Pomfret, the most affluent town in the JD has an estimated median family income of \$107,109. This compares with the statewide figure of \$108,890. The town of Windham has one of the lowest median family incomes in the state - \$54,533. Windham's low ranking was due in large part to Willimantic, where per capita income was estimated at \$17,294 as per the American Community Survey (2023).

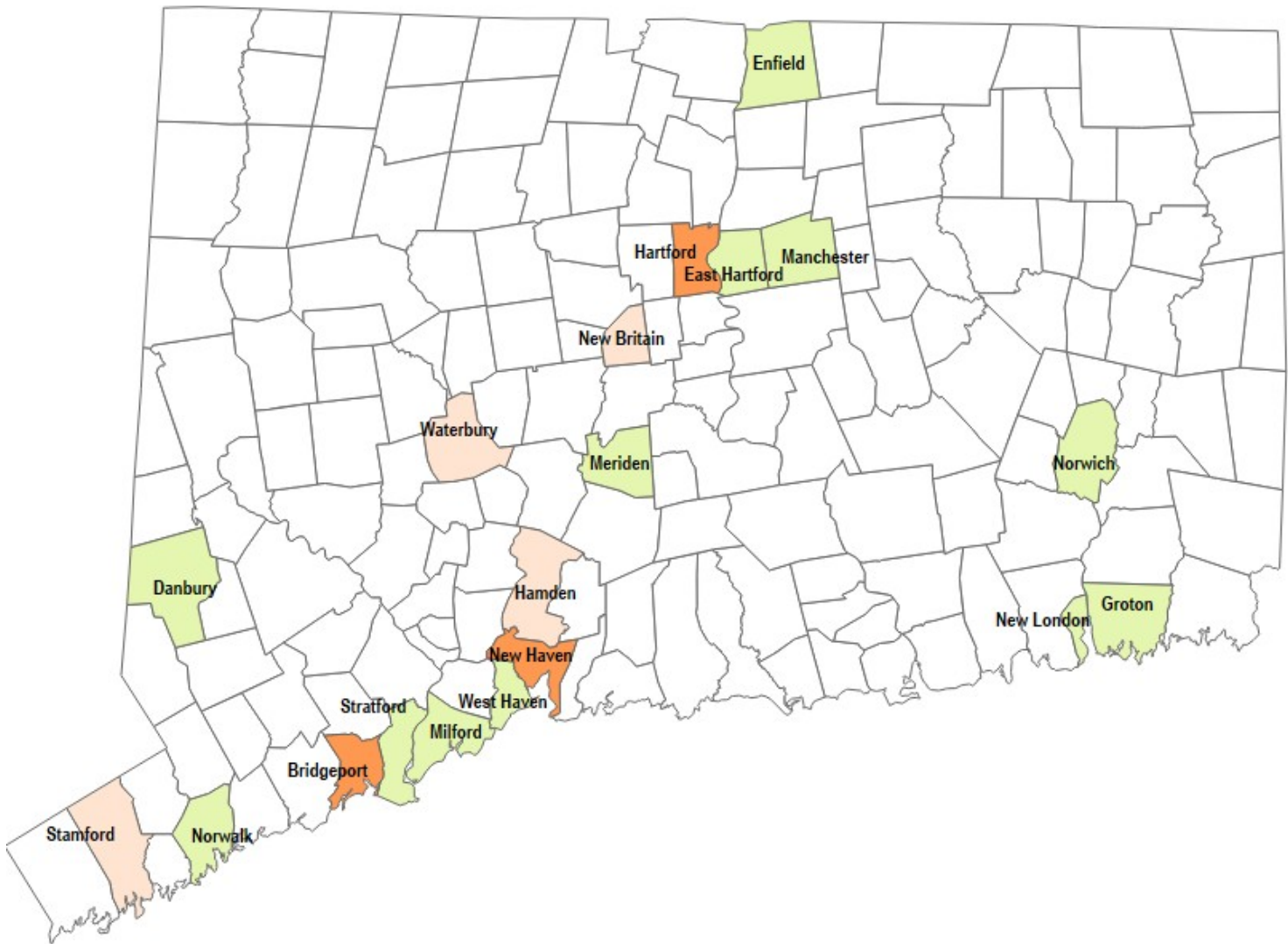

Demographics

The map below groups Connecticut's cities and towns into four groups based on reported violent crime. The three cities (Hartford, New Haven and Bridgeport) account for 40% of total violent crime, the remaining groups each represent roughly 20% of reported violent crime.

Crime

Each year, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) releases its Uniform Crime Report (UCR) which details the number of major crimes that were reported by state and local jurisdictions in the previous calendar year. In the FBI data, violent crimes include murders, non-negligent manslaughters, robberies, aggravated assaults and sexual assaults. Property crimes include larcenies, burglaries and motor vehicle thefts.

As is the case in most years, Windham (and the city of Willimantic therein) reported the most violent crime in the JD. The city also led the JD with the most reported property crimes (36%).

Compared to other JDs, Windham ranked tenth in the state for the number of reported violent crimes in 2024. As was previously noted, much of this crime was reported in the city of Windham. The violent crime rate in the Windham JD was the ninth highest in the state.

Arrests

State Police Troop D and the Willimantic Police Department (Willimantic PD) are the most active law enforcement agencies in the JD. In 2024, State Police Troop D made 33% of the JD's arrests while the Willimantic PD made 34%.

Case Movement

The majority of cases disposed in Connecticut courts each year are handled in 17 Geographic Area (GA) courts. GA courts typically handle less serious felonies as well as all misdemeanor cases and other low level offenses. In 2024, the Windham JD handled about 840 motor vehicle cases and 2,000 criminal cases. The Windham JD ranked second to last in the state for the number of infractions added.

Criminal and motor vehicle matters are not the only cases handled in the criminal court system. Infractions (which are usually disposed of with payment of a fine) transfer to GA courts if they are not resolved by prosecutors working at the Judicial Branch's Centralized Infraction Bureau. Regional infraction hubs handle the largest share of these cases.

Criminal Possession of a Firearm

Cases analyzed on this page all include (at least) a charge of 53a-217 or 53a-217c. Other charges may be present on the file. Conviction rates are based on a case level disposition whereby, should one charge levied against the defendant result in a conviction, the case is deemed to be a conviction. The charge of criminal possession of a firearm may or may not be the charge resulting in the conviction on a particular case.

Pending Cases Trends

Overall, pending case counts have declined over the past five years. The tables below show the January 1st figures for criminal and motor vehicle cases pending in each court around the state. These figures, typically, do not include infractions. The number of pending cases in Part B courts increased for the first time in five years in 2025.

Pending Cases Trends

As the number of pending cases has increased in the Windham Part A court, the mixture of offenses on the docket has changed. The tables below depict the changing landscape of the top ten cases over the past three years. As the number of pending cases in Part A has declined, one effect has been to concentrate the most serious offenses in the Part A.

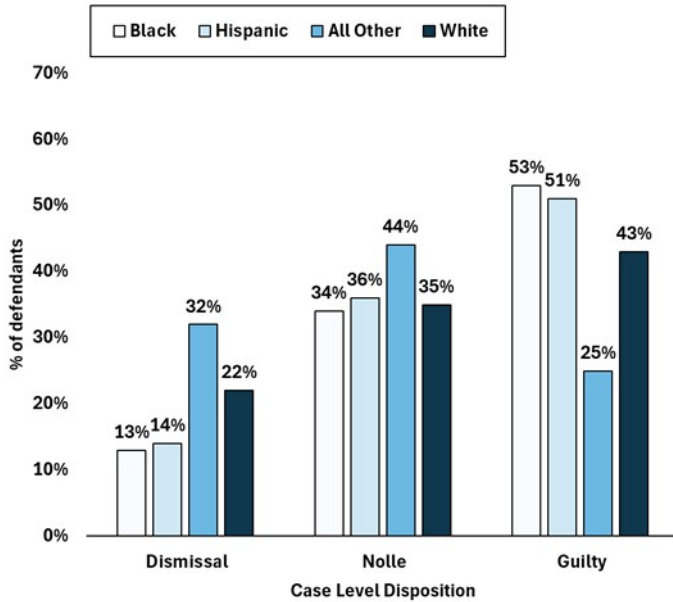

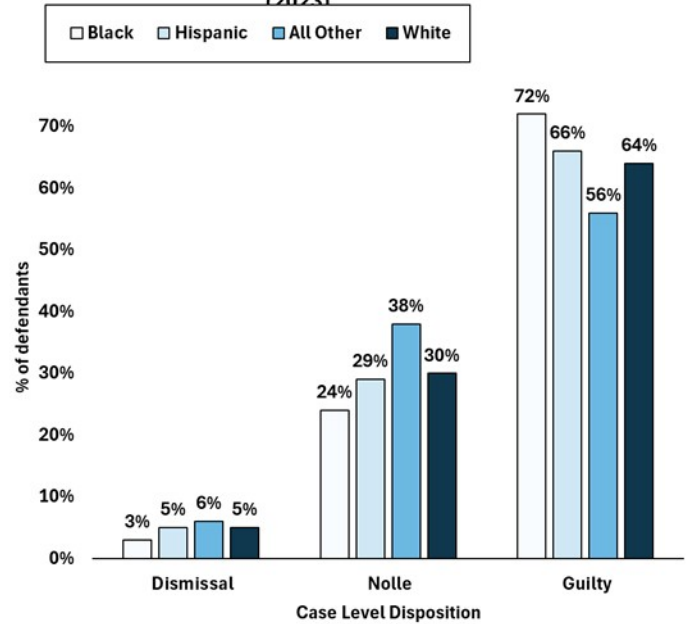

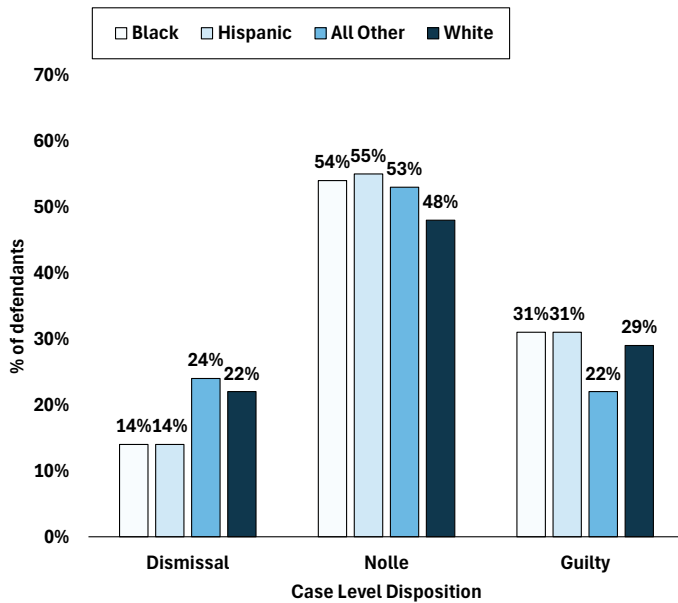
Windham Judicial District - All Defendants (2023)



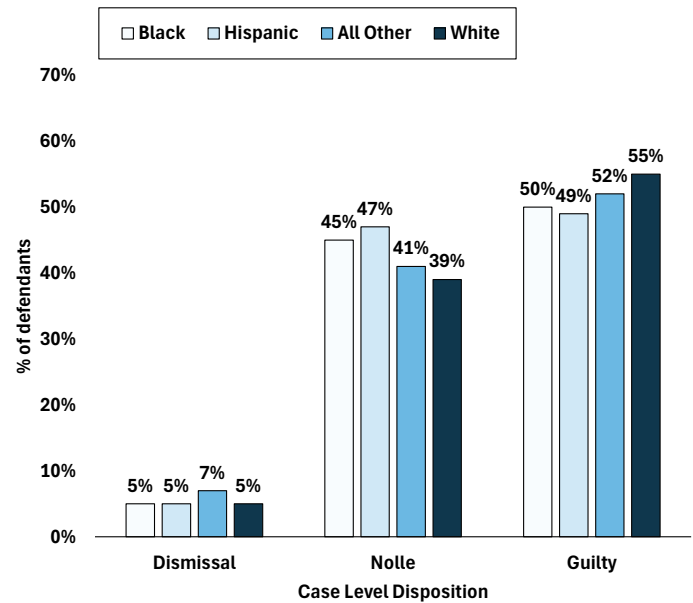
Windham Judicial District - Felony Criminal History (2023)

Trials

The figures shown below represent cases that reach a verdict across the state. For purposes of this data analysis, it is important to note that some cases are submitted to the jury but do not result in a unanimous verdict. Such cases, despite the workload involved, do not get counted in the trial data submitted by the Judicial Branch to the Division. Some cases move through the trial process only to resolve by plea agreement prior to jury deliberations. When cases resolve via plea agreement in this way they are not counted as a trial even though the prosecutor has picked a jury and presented evidence.

Court operations, particularly trials, were limited in 2021 and 2022 by the social distancing guidelines enacted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. These precautions delayed trial preparations and therefore trial hearings well beyond the court closures which initially were lifted in the summer of 2020, but were reinstated periodically over the next year.
